#### History of St Edwards Parish 2015 to 2025.

In 2015 St Edwards Parish South Tamworth welcomed a new priest Father Paul Aguilar from the Philippines to take over from Father John Willis who retired to Nazareth House. Fr Aguilar had previously served as a curate at St Edwards a few years before hand and, thus, was familiar with much of the activities of the parish. Fr Paul had served at the Cathedral at Armidale and as priest at Wee Waa so he had experience of the New England and Western Plains life-style.

Being a new young priest from the Philippines Fr Paul attracted a following of his countrymen and women and began a transformation of the parish into a multi-cultural parish. Catholic migrants from the Philippines, Myanmar, Vietnam, Karen and the Fijian Islands to name a few, flocked to St Edwards parish often to celebrate Mass and to sing in celebration of their culture in their native languages. Migrant Sunday Mass became a feature of worship at our Church.

The next twelve years saw four distinct changes in the life of St Edwards parish. These changes also reflected the cultural expansion of Tamworth which now boasts of a population comprising over 80 different nationalities. The celebrations at Mass took on a different and colorful interpretation and worship often being very meaningful even to the other parishioners.


Secondly the parish social activities became more vibrant and the various communities celebrated special days with pageantry and magnificent culinary repasts. These feats were thoroughly enjoyed by everyone from their own communities and from the other groups as well.


The third change was to the physical structures in and around the church. The altar was renovated with the erection of a new cross as a centre-piece above the altar and positioning of three new pictures on the altar itself. Also a special grotto was positioned at the side altar with a relic from Saint Mary McKillop.


Of special action was the erection of the War Memorial Bell Tower which was originally envisaged when the new church was erected over 50 years ago. Similarly the Sacred Door was positioned at the entrance to the church as a place of pilgrimage. Father Paul left us in late 2023 having seen the parish transform into a variation of a traditional Australian Catholic parish with a multi-cultural focus in keeping with the cities' population growth.

In early 2024 Fr Roelle Llave, also from the Philippines who was ordained with Fr Paul, was appointed as priest in charge which position was upgraded to Parish Priest in September 2025. Along with the upgraded appointment, Father Mario Mendoza was assigned to the Parish as an assistant. Fr Rolle has continued with the work of Fr Paul and has commenced celebrating Mass at the new retirement centre at the Longyard Complex.






