

Subject to the future NSW Health restrictions, from the first weekend in July (03-04) the following will take effect:

- spacing of church pews to return to normal,
- we return to 3 weekend Masses – Sat 5.30pm, Sun 9.00am & 5.30pm
- ministers will no longer be required to wear face masks during the distribution of holy communion,
- simple sign of peace to be reintroduced but with no physical contact,
- 6 months roster for Readers, Commentators and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC).

**Gospel | Mark 4:26-34**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

Jesus said to the crowds: 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

**Our History, Our Story**  
**1961-1971**

In 1970 Father Bill Dowd was appointed assistant priest at South. He has been a Christian Brother for many years before his ordination in Rome in 1967. He was very much at home in a school situation and was with the Parish for 12 months before moving to Mungindi as Parish Priest.

Father Meehan returned to South and in November 1971 St Edwards Parish celebrated its 10th Anniversary with a luncheon in the hall attended by Vicar Capitular, Monsignor Maurice Tully and ladies from all Tamworth Churches and Catholic Women's League from other towns. Guest speaker was Mary Rossi of Sydney and 220 women attended. We were in a surprisingly good position; we had a Presbytery, Convent, Parish Hall, four Infant classrooms, a new Primary School on the land purchased in Hillvue Road and a remarkable, loyal parish spirit. Father Meehan's favourite expression was "This will put St Edwards on the map." His pride in his flock's smallest achievement was overwhelming at times, but he had reason to be proud of his work over ten years. It was an extraordinary success.
