First Reading | Acts 9:26-3

A reading from the Acts of Apostles

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you.

‘Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing.

‘Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away – he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.’

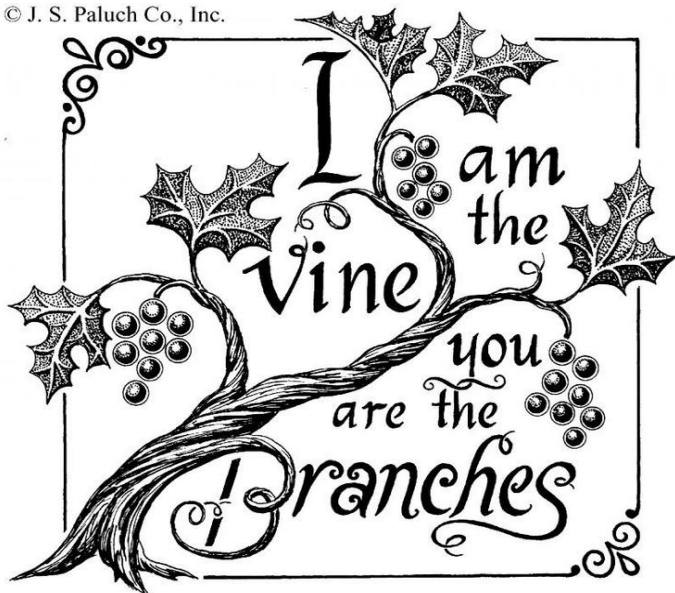

Our History, Our Story
1961-1971

Over the next 12 months, the Parish Newsletter will provide a brief history of the 60 years of St Edward's Parish.

The southern end of St Patrick's Parish West Tamworth was proclaimed a separate parish by Bishop Edward Doody on October 20 1961. Boundaries were the Werris Creek Road, Kent Street, Goonoo Goonoo Creek and the Peel River almost to Piallamore, across to the Great Dividing Range at meridian 151 degrees of longitude down to the Sugarloaf Range.

The opening Mass of the new Parish was celebrated by Bishop Doody and Father Meehan on the 9th November 1961.

Father Meehan was appointed the first Parish Priest. He chose the saint under whose name the Parish would be known. With the Bishop and the new Parish Priest sharing the same Christian name, it was perhaps inevitable the Parish was called after St Edward, King and Confessor, an early English King.
