July | Month of the Precious Blood of Jesus

July 1 is the traditional Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. Like other Christological devotions and pieties, the Precious Blood comes from the lines of popular Christian devotion on His blessed Passion and death. The precious blood devotion accentuates the message of Jesus' shedding of His blood in connection to a particular effect of salvation in us which is the purification of the faithful from the defilement of sin. The Old Testament's prefigurations are very clear about this: Moses received the first type of Jesus when he received the instruction from God to put the blood of the unblemished lamb on the doorposts of their households so that the "angel of death" would "passover" those houses marked by the blood of the lamb. In the fulfillment of this prefiguration, Jesus marks the new doorposts of salvation: the wood of the cross through which we enter new life in our faith relationship with God. We enter God's life through the cross, where is also the altar of the new sacrifice drenched by the blood of the Lamb of God. In the Church, we also find several places where according to tradition, the actual relics of the Lord's Precious Blood is kept. Most of these relics link themselves to various personages such as the Blessed Virgin or of St. Longinus, the soldier who pierced Christ's side. The list is not exhaustive, and we have saw fit not to include Eucharistic Miracles or blood exuding from sacred images of our Lord.

The 10 COVID Safe Practices

1. Any person with co-morbidities and those over 70 years of age should exercise particular caution.
2. In some cases it may be more appropriate for some individuals to attend a weekday Mass when there are less people present or to receive pastoral care from clergy in their home.
3. DO NOT ENTER if you are unwell, have fever or respiratory infection or have been to any COVID-19 hotspot area in the last 14 days.
4. Always check-in (QR code or manually) before entering the church.
5. Please observe physical distancing inside the Church, at the foyer and immediate surroundings.
6. Use hand sanitiser when entering and leaving the church. Always practice good hygiene.
7. Church bulletins are for single use only. Please take them with you when you leave.
8. The use of cry room is reserved only for parents with pre-school children. Maximum of 3 families.
9. After each Service, the pews, door handles and touchpoints are cleaned with disinfectants.
10. All are required to wear facemask inside the church.

Our History, Our Story | 1971-1981

Father Frank spent some weeks meeting his people, listening to them and addressing the apparently never ending parish needs. First he gave the go-ahead to Father Meehan's proposal for two further classrooms on Hillvue Road with staff room and toilets. Weekly notice sheets were introduced, men and women began reading at Sunday Masses and families now brought up the offertory gifts. A parish meeting was called on 20th May, 1973. Originally plans had been to erect a War Memorial Church on Hillvue Road. Father and the Finance Committee felt increased school enrolments presented a more urgent need, so classrooms at the Infants School needed to be built immediately. Concern was expressed that the Hillvue Road site could not be supervised out of school hours. As a second priest was expected to be appointed shortly, the meeting decided to build a new Presbytery on Hillvue Road and 2 further classrooms at Robert Street.
