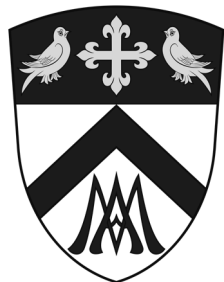

with you Christ became man.*

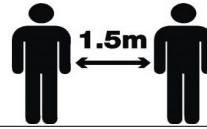
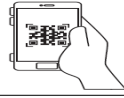

Fr Le Fevre last assistant priest was Father Ron Perrett. Father Perrett was Diocesan Director of Caritas, a vital work in the church. This kept him busy but he always remained devoted to parishioners and their needs. Later he was parish priest of Gunnedah and is now retired, living in Armidale.

For several years Father Le Fevre had no priest to support him as the chronic shortage of priests caught up with the diocese. However, the parish building program was at an end. We were established at last, so he was able to relax and enjoy being a pastor.

**CORONAVIRUS UPDATE
80% REOPENING ROADMAP
FROM MONDAY 18TH OCTOBER, 2021**

Now that the 80% fully vaccinated rate has been reached, the requirements under the NSW government roadmap have again changed.

CHURCH ENTRY

- Entry to churches is open for both fully vaccinated and not fully vaccinated (1 dose & non-vaccinated)
- QR code check in is still required and an alternative written sign in option
- Social distancing is required at 4m²
- Masks are required inside the church but not outside

SINGING DURING MASS, WEDDINGS & FUNERALS

- Singing is not permitted by congregants but there may be a sole singer if they are fully vaccinated or a choir of up to 10 people who are: fully vaccinated and socially distanced from each other and are separated from the parishioners

WEDDINGS & FUNERALS

- Attendance is unlimited but subject to density limits for the church based on the 4m² rule HOWEVER there is still a 5 guest limit for weddings and a 10 mourner limit for funerals if there are not fully vaccinated persons present

EMPLOYEES & VOLUNTEERS

- Staff and volunteers who are not fully vaccinated are to wear a mask at work.
- Employees may continue to work from home, if reasonably practicable.

LIVESTREAMING MASS

- Livestreaming the 10.00 am Cathedral Parish Sunday Mass will not continue.

How to Gain a Plenary Indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory

All Souls Day, [is] a feast in which we pray for the holy souls in Purgatory. In addition to offering Mass and praying for the souls of the faithful departed, the Church also gives us the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory.

A plenary indulgence is “a remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraph 1471)

As the Catechism tells us in paragraphs 1472:

To understand this doctrine and practice of the Church, it is necessary to understand that sin has double consequence. Grave sin deprives us of communion with God and therefore makes us incapable of eternal life, the privation of which is called the “eternal punishment” of sin. On the other hand every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified here on earth, or after death in the state called Purgatory.

A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment, so for a person on earth it would be as though they had just been baptized. If they died at that moment they would go straight to heaven. The Church also gives us the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence for souls in Purgatory.

The Catechism says in paragraph 1479:

Since the faithful departed now being purified are also members of the same communion of saints, one way we can help them is to obtain indulgences for them, so that the temporal punishments due for their sins may be remitted.

Visit to a Church or Oratory on All Souls Day.

PLENARY INDULGENCE. A plenary indulgence, applicable ONLY to the souls in purgatory, may be obtained by those who, on All Souls Day, piously visit a church, public oratory, or for those entitled to use it, a semi-public oratory. It may be acquired either on the day designated as All Souls Day or, with the consent of the bishop, on the preceding or following Sunday or the feast of All Saints. On visiting the church or oratory it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

Visit to a Cemetery.

Only applicable to the souls in Purgatory when one devoutly visits and prays for the departed.

A PLENARY INDULGENCE is bestowed for this work each day between November 1 and November 8.

In addition to visiting these places and offering the prescribed prayers, the general requirements of indulgences must be met, which are:

- Pray for the intentions of our Holy Father
- Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day, or within several days if that is not possible)
- Go to Confession within about 20 days of the indulgenced work
- Be in a state of grace at the time the indulgenced work is completed
- For a plenary indulgence it is also necessary to have a complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.

Take advantage of this opportunity the Church has given us!
